### Weather Safety Notes:

- Frequent monsoon rainstorms may occur between late June and early September causing lightning and flash floods.
- Heavy snowfall may occur between early November and late April; 4x4 and/or chains may be required for travel.
- High winds combined with high temperatures and dry conditions may occur between May and July creating fire danger and Hualapai Mountain Park may be observing fire restrictions.

## Hualapai Mountain Park



Hualapai Mountain Park is a Mohave County-owned and operated regional park facility located in Kingman, Arizona. The Park was established in 1936 as a result of *The New Deal*, and constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps under the supervision of the National Parks Service.

Dating as far back as 1902, there are published accounts of the plant and animal communities found in the Hualapai Range which was considered a destination for wildlife observers. The Hualapai Mountains rise up to 8,417 feet above sea level and are surrounded by deserts forming a "sky island". The much cooler climate found in the Park allows for a wide variety of plant and animal life to thrive in an otherwise challenging environment.

This guide lists the wildlife and vegetation that are commonly seen around the Park.
